Manson cleared of sexual-assault charge

▲ PREPARE TO BE SLIGHTLY DISTURBED. ▲ MARILYN MANSON spent a recent day in a Michigan courtroom answering felony sexual-assault charges. Security guard Joshua Keasler apparently had a beef, accusing Manson of rubbing his genitals on the back of Keasler's head and leaving a "liquid substance" in his hair during a summer 2001 Ozzfest gig. Following a three-hour hearing that saw Keasler reenact the incident as spectators giggled, Manson walked away with a measly misdemeanor charge. "I'm not completely happy," said Manson afterward. "But I'm happier than when I got here." He then demanded the return of his liquid substance.
